To qualify for affordable housing through the CHA you:

- can not have a annual income above 80% of the area median income.
- have at least one member of the household who is a U.S. citizen or national, or have eligible immigration status.
- have a social security number(s) and provide accurate information to CHA.
- can not have been convicted of, or involved in specific criminal activities or engaged in prohibited behaviors listed on CHA's website.

To qualify for housing through CES you:

- must be currently experiencing homelessness
- must be within the city of Chicago

Veterans and individuals ages 18-25 qualify for specific programs (see back).

CES ranks applicants

in order of length of homelessness and "vulnerability" with the most vulnerable households at the top.



Outside of Chicago, affordable housing qualifications vary by city.

Housing Services for Specialized Populations and Additional Resources

Youth Housing Services (18-24)

If you are between the age of 18 -24 and are currently homeless, unstably housed, or fleeing domestic violence, you may qualify for specialized housing. US Veteran Housing Services

If you are a veteran and are currently homeless or unstably housed you may qualify for specialized housing through Chicago's Ending Veterans Homelessness Initiative (EVHI). To find a shelter or begin the application process for housing, please call the Veterans Resource Office at 312-743-0720 or the Community Resource and Referral Center at 312-569-5750.
